Learn how to build a high/low collection for "at risk teens." Get a list of publishers who are consistently producing easy reading materials that teens love to read. Through book talks and handouts, LiBretto will conduct a one hour workshop that includes all the information to create a classroom library of high/low books for reluctant reading teens or to expand a public library collection to bring in new readers.
